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


Newsletter 11 - April 2024

<u>Attendance</u>

We have received a number of requests for leaves of absence from school. Absence is not permitted during term-time unless it meets the following criteria:

- Your child is too ill to attend school please see this <u>guidance from the</u> <u>NHS</u> (Please inform the school office as soon as possible)
- You have made a request to the headteacher to request a leave of absence - please note that absences will only be authorised in exceptional circumstances

Holidays must not be booked in term time this includes in and around bank holidays.
